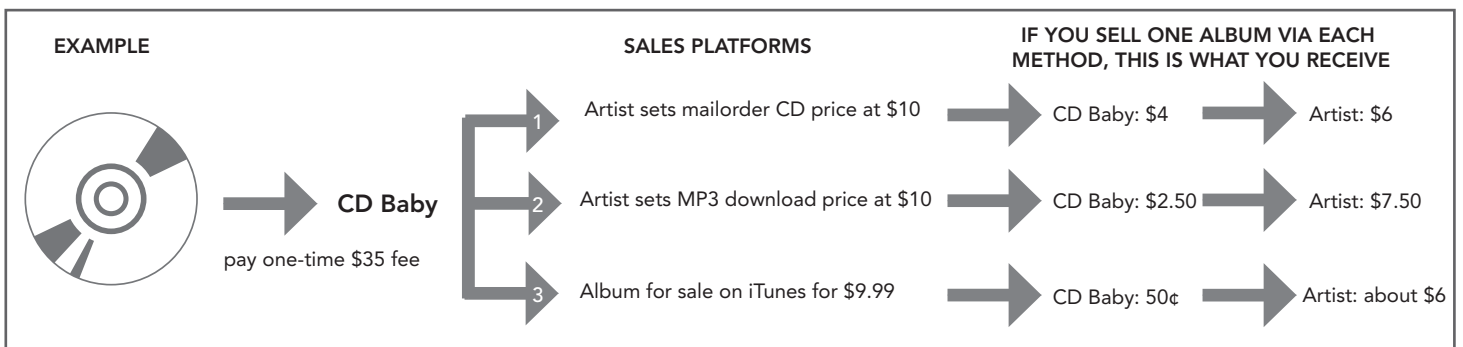




How to get your music into digital music services

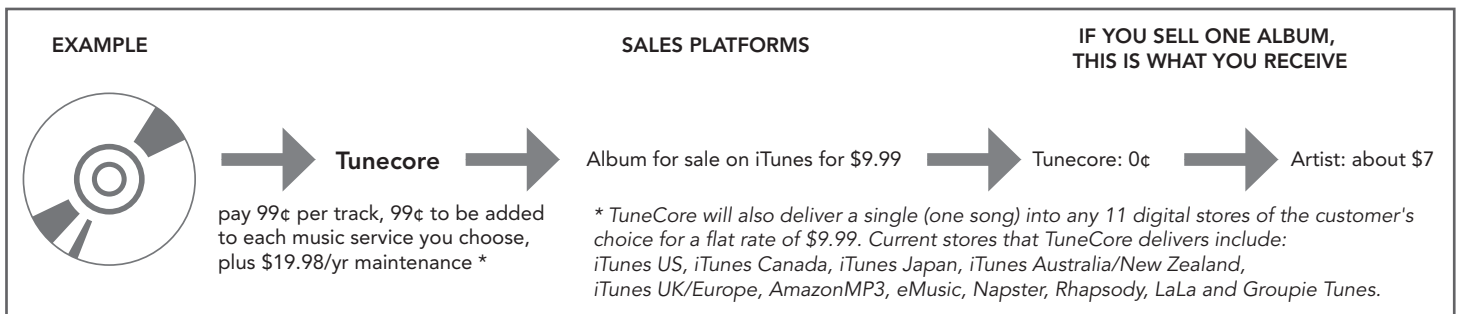
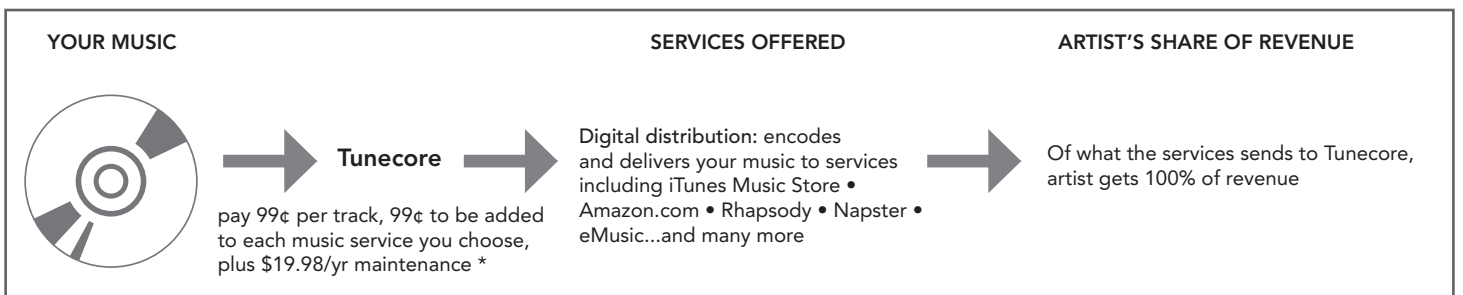
